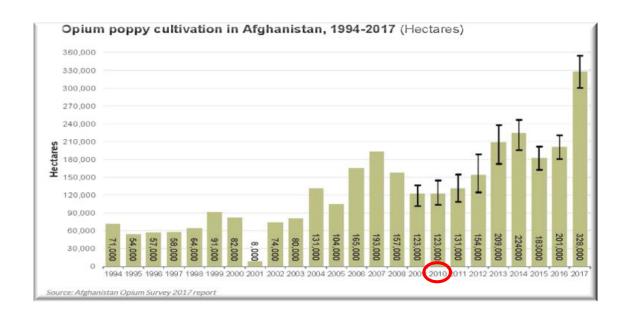

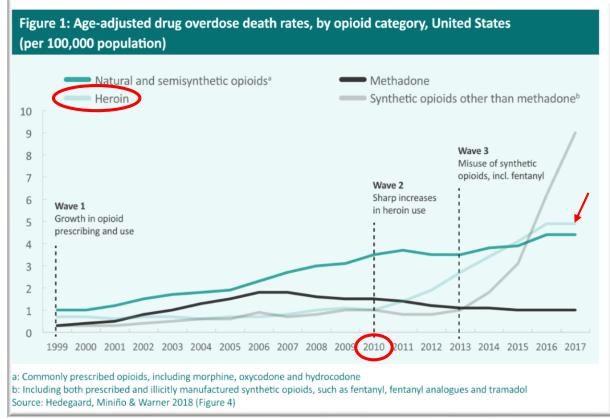

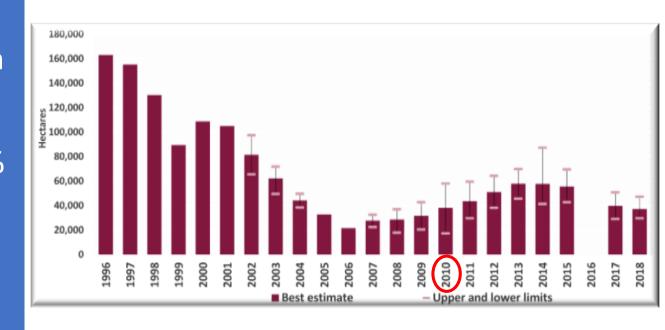

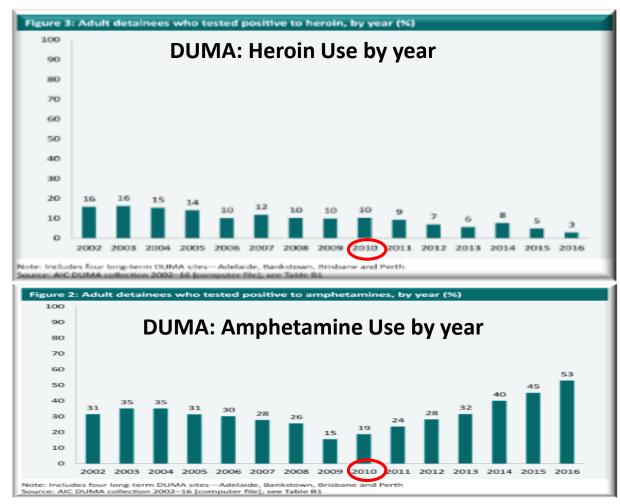

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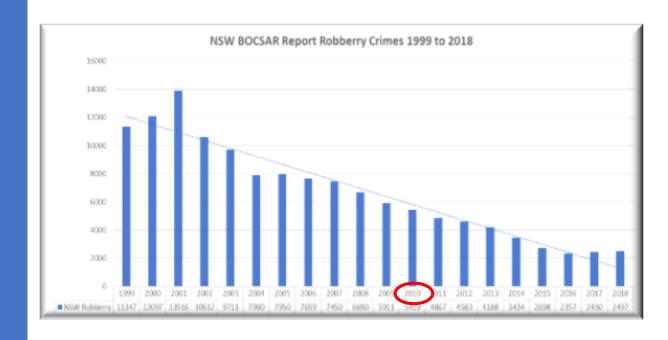

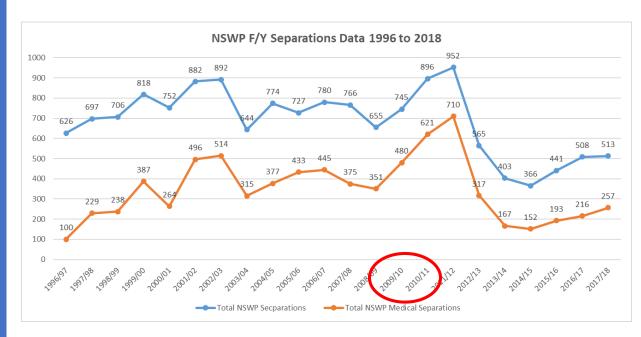

Forecast: 'Two storms are coming'.

Expect:

- An illicit drug 'marketing' war 'Plant v Chemical'
- Crime rates very likely to dip then increase.
- Traditional crime costs exclude law enforcement social, WC & WHS crime costs.
- Police will not be able to cope.
- Social systems may fail (Opium Wars).

Findings:

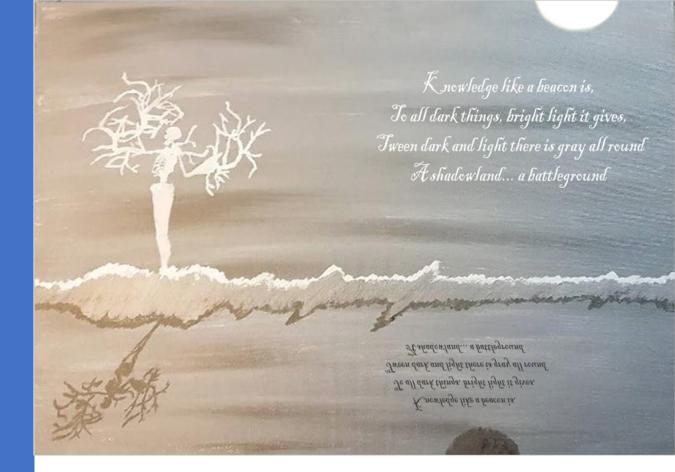
- Illicit drugs are weapons of social destruction.
- We are unprepared.

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Recommendations:

- Learn from past mistakes.
- Decriminalise illicit drug-use.
- Develop a health focused intervention program:
 - Include Govt. Academia, Industry & Community.
 - Responsible use-harm reduction (no harm self & others)
 - Work Health & Safety Legislation (S. 29 acts & omissions)
 - Mental Health Act (Sch II self-harm)
- Increase illicit drug (import/supply) penalties.
- Include corporate (WHS) white collar crime & social costs.
- Research first responder (& ADF) suicides (WHS crimes?).
- Royal Commission into first responder mental health (ADF).
