

The Changing World of Reporting

- Social media = significant source of reporting
- Both cold and current cases
- A problem
- An opportunity





QPS as an Example

- July 2018 June 2019
- QPS converted 100 Facebook posts into intelligence reports that were then further investigated
- + 18 Twitter posts immediately escalated to urgent 000 assist requests
 - showing the power of social media to inform the police as to current situations that need attention and avenues of potential investigation
