




## **Profile in NSW**



- Total NSW population in custody is 13650
- 1007 of those are women (7%)
- 341 (34%) of those women are Aboriginal
- 40% of all women in custody are on remand
- 25 pregnant women on any given day in NSW


# Custodial context for pregnant women in NSW


